Sub: Clarification on eligibility of candidature of OTET passed untrained candidates for the posts of S.S.

Sir,

I am directed to invite reference to your letter No(EOSS)-999/6075/13 Date.16.08.2013 on the above subject & to furnish the point wise clarification for further action at your end.

Point. I The SC, ST & PH category candidates who have passed +2 or its equivalent examination and having 45% marks in aggregate excluding marks secured in 4th/extra optional are eligible to apply for the post provided they have cleared OTET-I.

Point II

All the category of untrained B. Sc. passed candidates (UR, SC, ST, OBC, PH) who have cleared OTET-II & having requisite % of marks i.e. 50 % in aggregate in respect of general candidates & 45 % marks in aggregate incase of SC, ST, OBC / SEBC and PH candidates excluding the marks secured in extra optional / ancillary / foundation course shall apply for the posts earmarked for B.Sc., B.Ed. Sikshaya Sahayak.

The case of untrained candidates as at Para I & II shall only be considered after receipt of permission from Govt. of India for engagement of untrained candidates subject to condition that they will agree to complete the required training at their own cost within two years of engagement .software to be changed accordingly.

The draft undertaking shall be in the following manner:

"I undertake that incase of my engagement as Sikshya Shayak I will be completing the required training at my cost within two years of engagement failing which I will be disqualified to continue".

Point III & IV - Candidates passed in OTET - I can apply under B.Ed. category posts provided the candidate has B.Sc. qualification. But, candidates passed in OTET -II can not apply under CT category posts.

Points V The date of counting the age limit is **01.04.2013** (1st April, 2013).
