Nepean Sea Road is named after Sir Evan Nepean (1751-1822), 1st Baronet and the Governor of Bombay from 1812-1819.

When he was appointed as the Governor of Bombay, the Queen granted Sir Nepean a 2-acre land parcel set along the Arabian Sea for his residence. Thus began the royal sojourn where Rajas and Maharajas from across India, in a bid to be closer to British Royalty, chose to build a royal abode here, marking a turning point in the history of the region.

Since then, Nepean Sea Road has remained the epitome of a luxury address. Stately private villas, princely palaces, old bungalows and luxury residences always graced Nepean Sea Road. Many Maharajas, including those from Baroda, Gwalior, Indore, Wankaner, Hyderabad, Rewa and Kutch, built palatial homes in and around Nepean Sea Road.

THE ROYALS OF BANSDA FROM GUJARAT TO MUMBAI

Bansda (or Vansda), is a princely state in the southern part of Gujarat.

Believed to be descendants of the fierce
Rajput clan, the Royals of Bansda were renowned
for visionary architecture, urban
town planning and art.

Given the dry, hot, desert-air summers of Gujarat,
like many Maharajas and Princes of Gujarat,
Mewar and Rajasthan,
they commissioned a Summer home in Mumbai,
the jewel overlooking the sea.

It goes without saying that they selected the turf of royals even then – 91, Nepean Sea Road.

ARTS

National Centre for the Performing Arts - India's first premier cultural centre, it has been committed to preserving and promoting Indian and international arts and culture as well as presenting new and innovative work in the field of the performing arts.

Jehangir Art Gallery - Built in 1952, it has evolved as the center of art activity in the city over the years and is a rendezvous point for artists, patrons and art lovers.

Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya (CSMVS) formerly Prince of Wales museum - The city's main museum built in the Indo-Saracenic style of architecture in the early 20th century to commemorate the visit of the then Prince of Wales.



INDUIGENCE

The Palladium Hotel - A decadent and luxury oasis for leisure and business travelers owing to its proximity to the city's entertainment districts and commercial properties in the heart of Mumbai.

Trident Hotel by The Oberoi Group - An iconic Mumbai landmark soaring 35 storeys tall with 555 rooms and suites, it offers panoramic views of the Queen's necklace. Taj Hotel - The flagship hotel of the Taj group with 560 rooms and 44 suites is a historical and architectural marvel that has hosted many notable guests, from presidents to captains of industry and stars of show business.

Vivanta by Taj Hotels, Cuffe Parade - Premium hotel created for the cosmopolitan global traveller and bon vivant that combines contemporary luxury, cool informality and the charming Taj hospitality.



CULTURAL FESTIVALS

Banganga Festival - A two-day music festival celebrated in January in Malabar Hills witnesses musical performances of renowned artists from all over India to promote the preservation of the historical Banganga tank and its environment.

Kala Ghoda Arts festival -This nine-day annual festival featuring a variety of cultural events organized by the Kala Ghoda Assocation takes place in January or early February in the Kala Ghoda area of South Mumbai.



CRICKET STADIUMS

Wankhede Cricket Stadium - Built in 1974, with a seating capacity of 33,482, it is the city's main cricketing venue and has been host to numerous high profile cricket matches.

Brabourne Stadium - India's first permanent sporting venue, the ground has played host to tennis and football matches as well as music shows and concerts.



RELIGIOUS CENTRES

Mahalaxmi Mandir - A famous temple built in 1831 dedicated to Mahalakshmi, the central deity of Devi Mahatmyam. During Navratri celebrations, the temple is beautifully decorated and devotees from all over the country throng for Darshan.

Babulnath Temple - One of the oldest temples in the city, where lakhs of devotees worship Lord Shiva in the form of a Babul tree. Devotees climb up to obtain the blessings of the Shivling. Elevator facilties can also be availed.



HISTORICAL DESTINATIONS AND PLACES OF BEAUTY

Gateway of India - A 26-metres high basalt arch overlooking the Arabian Sea which earlier served as a jetty for British governors and other luminaries.

Hanging Gardens - Laid out in 1881 over Bombay's main reservoir, they are terraced gardens perched at the top of Malabar Hil which provide sunset views over the Arabian Sea and feature numerous hedges carved into the shapes of animals.



HIGH ENERGY EXCITEMENT

Mahalaxmi race course - A vast oval shaped 2,400 metres horse-racing track, spread over 225 acres of land facing the sea. The ground is opened to joggers, and is also rented out for outdoor events and weddings.
