This is the second report in the series and extends the range of data sources compared to the first report that relied heavily on the UN. Covers all peace operations with a significant military component. There are two preliminary chapters: on consolidating peace, and on developments in Sudan. These are followed by mission reviews and notes in A-Z order of location, and finally by extensive statistical information on peace operations.

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ASEAN : how it works / Jamil Maidan Flores

Jakarta: ASEAN Secretariat, 2000 v, 96 p. : II.

Short clearly presented guide to ASEAN covering its history, operational processes, achievements, and vision. Glossary.

Avionics and mission systems : a key element in delivering through-life capability / Keith Hayward and Michael Codnor

London : RUSI, 2006 v, 18 p.

Assesses the implications of Britain's Defence Industrial Strategy (DIS) for the maintenance of sustainable avionics support capability given that prime contractors may become also the main source of life-cycle management. Calls for government to clarify policy on what defence industries should be based in UK. Identifies the Total Support Services (TSS) alliance between three second tier avionics companies as a viable solution to the through life support challenge.

Beyond 'Artful' : government and industry roles in Britain's future submarine design, build and support / Gavin Ireland

London : RUSI, 2007 v, 26 p.

Study of the factors involved in designing, building, maintaining and ultimately decommissioning and scrapping Britain's nuclear powered submarines. This report considers how a multi-decade long submarine programme can be accommodated in Britain's Defence Industrial Strategy.

Beyond the carbon economy : energy law in transition / edited by Donald N Zillman, Catherine Redgwell, Yinka O Omorogbe and Lila K Barrera-Hernandez

Oxford ; New York, : Oxford Univ. Press., 2008 xvii, 562 p.

Study of law in relation to energy and particularly hydrocarbon based fuels. Looks at general aspects such as energy and health, sustainability, and energy efficiency, and then at specific aspects of energy law around the world such as clean energy in Africa, biofuels and wind energy in Europe, low carbon future in China, Mexico's oil based economy, non-fossil fuels in Japan, and energy resource management in Russia.

This book looks at some of the paradoxes of China's politics and suggests that internal unrest, anxiety about Japan, nationalistic attitudes to Taiwan, and complex relations with the USA, are all possible causes of unintended conflict. Author is an academic and former US Deputy Assistant Secretary of State responsible for China.

• China modernizes: threat to the west or model for the rest?/ Randall Peerenboom

Oxford ; New York : Oxford University Press, 2007 xv, 406 p.

Based on government statements and public opinion polls this book considers China's development of and adherence to rule of law by measuring against other developing countries and particularly those with "Asian values" as opposed to Western liberal democracies. Concludes that the East Asian Model has distinct regional characteristics which have worked well and offers useful lessons but mere replication is no more a guarantee of success than would be expected were a state to simply copy a Western model.

Climate change : what it means for us, our children and our grandchildren/ edited by Joseph F C Dimento and Pamela Doughman

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Cambridge, MA : the MIT Press, 2007 xii, 217 p.

Intended for general readers the book explains the basics of greenhouse gases and climate change, discusses how certain the scientific community is about global warming, what the effects might be, and what can be done to reduce the impact.

Command legacy : a tactical primer for junior leaders/ Raymond A Millen

2nd ed. Dulles VA : Potomac Books, 2008 xxi, 413 p.

Deals with the practical aspects of small unit tactics, techniques, and procedures for junior leaders. Written by a US Army infantry officer to provide a single easy to use source for command at company level and below. In this edition some diagrams have been updated and there is a new chapter on Counterinsurgency.

inequalities within states that are the prime obstacles to poverty reduction, and that these in turn give rise to violence, criminality, and regional insecurity. The paper makes policy recommendations to reduce the causes of these risks.

Global warming and China's environmental diplomacy / Yu Hongyuan

New York : Nova Science, 2008 xii, 199 p.

Study of ways in which international regimes influence policy development in China. The study assesses the factors and processes that have affected China's position on climate change and in particular the role of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

Modern bombers : aircraft, weapons and their battlefield might/ Anil R Pustam

London : Greenhill Books; Mechanicsburg PA : Stackpole Books, 2004 72 p. : ill.

Photographic guide to the B-52, B-1B, and B-2 bombers of the U.S. Air Force.

Negotiating the impossible?: the Beslan hostage crisis / Adam Dolnik

London : RUSI, 2007 v, 45 p.

Based on interviews, primary documents, and open source materials in several languages this report considers the Beslan school hostage crisis. As well as providing background to the event (including a chronology) and to its mastermind Shamil Basayev, the papers main concerns are with the negotiation process, the reasons for its failure and the identification of practical lessons. Concludes a) that barricade hostage taking by terrorist groups is likely to occur again, b) that the hostage takers have specific objectives, c) that there is some scope for successful negotiations, and d) that governments should not cover up the outcomes of such events in subsequent reports.

Reforming nuclear export controls : the future of the Nuclear Suppliers Group / Ian Anthony, Christer Ahlstrom and Vitaly Fedchenko

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Oxford ; New York : Oxford University Press, 2007 ix, 136 p.

Study with recommendations on how to enhance nuclear export controls to ensure that the proliferation of nuclear technology for peaceful purposes does not contribute to the spread of nuclear weapons. Looks at the Nuclear Suppliers Group guidelines, the challenges facing the NSG, and the cases of nuclear technology in Iran and India.

Regional outlook : Southeast Asia 2009-2010 / edited by Ian Storey and Lee Poh Onn

Singapore : ISEAS , 2009 155 p.

Secret intelligence : a reader/ edited by Christopher Andrew, Richard J Aldrich, and Wesley K Wark

London : Routledge, 2009 xxi, 552 p.

Collection of previously published material that provides a good mix of current thinking and older ideas on intelligence in its broadest sense. Contributions are mainly from the United States and Britain with input also from the Netherlands and Australia. The book is arranged in four main sections: the intelligence cycle; intelligence, counter-terrorism and security; ethics, accountability and control; and intelligence and the new warfare. Includes intelligence failures, intelligence and covert action, and the role of intelligence in peace operations. Each paper concludes with suggested further readings and with a list of questions that could be set as essay titles or could form the basis of seminar discussions.

► Take me to your officer : officership in the Army / Stephen Deakin ... [et al.].

Swindon UK : Strategic and combat Studies Institute, 2008 82 p.

Contains eight papers on what is meant by officership - the condition of being and fulfilling the role of an officer in modern armed forces. Contributions discuss officership at RMA Sandhurst, the British police officer, the officer ethos in the US Army, the professionalisation changes experienced by the Dutch army following the end of conscription, and the officer concept among Canadian officers and NCOs.

► The African military in the 21st century : report of the 2007 Tswalu Dialogue / Chris Brown ... [et al.].

London : RUSI, 2007 vi, 98 p.

Papers from the Tswalu Dialogue held 3-6 May 2007. The first two papers address the development of armed forces in Africa in line with concepts of collective security, while the rest deal mainly with peacekeeping and peace operations in Africa, and the lessons that events elsewhere in the world might usefully provide for Africa.

The ascendancy of political risk management and its implications for global security and business investment / Peter Truscott

London : RUSI, 2006 viii, 146 p.

Argues that risk management inherently requires a deeper understanding and appreciation of political risk if it is to play an efficient role in assessing and mitigating commercial risk. Political risk has a fundamental role in the generation of commercial risk. Uses case studies to examine the defence and energy sectors, and considers a variety of risk models to identify whether they are appropriate in this context. Author has served in both British and European parliaments.

• The dynamics of public policy : theory and evidence / drian Kay

Cheltenham, UK : Edward Elgar, 2006 vii, 149 p.

Discussion of the effect of time on policy dynamics with the first part offering a theoretical perspective, and the second providing some case studies: the EU budget system; the EU's Common Agricultural Policy; the UK's GP fundholding scheme; and the British pharmaceutical industry.

 The illuatrated encyclopedia of rifles and machine guns / William Fowler and Patrick Sweeney

London : Lorenz Books, 2007

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256 p. : col. ill.

The first part of this well illustrated book gives a history of the development of rifles and machine guns up to the present day assault rifles and miniguns, and includes examples of good and bad designs, followed by sections on each of the main categories. Each section is arranged by country from west to east starting from north and south America. Entries are in A-Z order by manufacturer and give a short description, picture and brief technical specifications. Glossary and index.

This book looks at the impact of the European Unions 1999 decision to develop its own military capabilities on relations between the Nordic states and the EU and NATO, and on the the Nordic states' own defence positions. The book is thus an assessment of overlapping and interlocking multilateral security and economic communities, and the tensions between national and international policies.

► The United Kingdom's independent strategic nuclear deterrent : observations on the 2006 White Paper and issues for the parliamentary debate / Michael Codnor, Gavin Ireland, and Lee Willett

London : RUSI, 2007 vii, 17 p.

Provides background information considered relevant to the government's deliberations about the future of UK's nuclear deterrent. Finds that a submarine based system is the only viable option, that such a deterrent does not breach Britain's NPT obligations, that conflict between major states remains a strategic concern for the future and deterrence remains a policy instrument.

The world encyclopedia of pistols, revolvers, and sub-machine guns / William Fowler, Anthony North and Charles Stronge

London : Lorenz Books, 2007 256 p. : col. ill.

Extensively illustrated book that gives a history of the development of firearms and cartridges up to the present day, followed by sections on each of the main categories. Each section is arranged by country from west to east starting from north and south America. Entries give a short description, picture and brief technical specifications, and are in A-Z order by manufacturer. Glossary and index.

Thicker than oil : America's uneasy partnership with Saudi Arabia/ Rachel Bronson

New York : Oxford University Press, 2006 xi, 353 p.

History of the development of the strong and abiding relations between the United States and Saudi Arabia. Suggests that despite the upsurge of anti-American feeling in some quarters and the effect of continued conflict between Israel and Lebanon the longer term prospects are good.

Traditional classics on leadership/ edited by J Thomas Wren, Douglas A Hicks and Terry L Price

Cheltenham, UK : Edward Elgar , 2004 xxvi, 339 p.

Collection of previously published works ranging from Plato to Marx that deal with the morality of leadership, ideal leadership, legitimacy, the status of followers, and challenges to authority. This is the first of a three volume set.

Regional strategy for a nuclear - weapon free zone : Asean case/ C.P. F. Luhulima

ASEAN's initiative to establish such a zone was based on the 1971 declaration of establishing a Zone of Peace Freedom and neutrality in Southeast Asia. Indonesia and Malaysia were the first ASEAN countries to recommend the establishment of a Southeast Asia Nuclear Weapon Free Zone (SEANWFZ). in the mid-1990s. In article 1 (a) and 1 (b) of the treaty provide that (a) Southeast Asia Nuclear Weapon-Free Zone hereinafter referred to as the Zone means the area comprising the territories of all states in Southeast Asia namely Brunei Darussalam. Cambodia. Indonesia. Laos. Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam and Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZ), (b) territory means the land territory, internal waters, territorial sea, archipelagic waters.
