Comprehensive review of China's military development that starts with economic, demographic, and social trends that affect underlying resource potentials. Next considers doctrine, command structure, manpower and arms trade, then looks in turn at land, sea, and air forces, before concluding with nuclear forces and paramilitaries. An appendix gives 32pp of statistics and tables on the military balance in Asia.

Oxford, UK: Butterworth Heinemann, 2005 xxvi, 231 p.

Guide to coaching which starts from the principle that knowledge and understanding of people are essential prerequisites to being able to coach either oneself or someone else. Contains practical advice on the processes of coaching, the coaching relationship, methods of assessment, examples, and what to do when either the client or the process becomes stuck. Includes advice on selfdevelopment.

► Crossed swords : Pakistan, its army and the wars within/ Shuja Nawaz

Karachi; Oxford : Oxford University Press, 2008 xliv, 655 p.

Comprehensive history of Pakistan's Army (and to a much lesser extent the Navy and Air Force) which shows how the Army became increasingly involved in Pakistan's politics to the point where "... its influence pervades civil society in ways that are pernicious, and in tasks for which it has not been trained." (author's preface). The book also covers Pakistan's close military ties with the USA, the break with East Pakistan, the various conflicts with India, and involvement in Afghanistan and with the Taliban. An appendix gives parallel timelines of military and civil events. Bibliography, index.

► Effective succession planning : ensuring leadership continuity and building talent from within/ William J Rothwell

Comprehensive guide to the process of succession planning that highlights its importance at all levels of an organisation. Starts with some thought provoking scenarios, then looks at succession planning successes in American corporations, considers influences such as demographics and corporate ethics, then gets down to the detail of the succession planning process. The accompanying CD-ROM includes case studies, worksheets, assessment tools, training guides, and briefings on mentoring, executive level succession, and manager level succession.

Essentials of assessment with brief intelligence tests / Susan RHomack and Cecil R Reynolds.

Hoboken NJ; Chichester UK: John Wiley, 2007 x, 189 p.

Describes and identifies uses and limitations of four different brief (i.e. can usually be undertaken in 30 minutes) intelligence tests. These are: Kaufmann Brief Intelligence Test 2nd ed(KBIT-2); Reynolds Intellectual Screening Test (RIST); Wechsler Abbreviated Scale of intelligence (WASI); and the Wide Range Intelligence test (WRIT). The book is part of a series intended for readers in clinical and related fields (e.g. schools).

Annual publication which provides a wealth of detailed information on the political, economic and commercial institutions of the world in 2 volumes. Volume 1 contains a comprehensive listing of more than 1,900 international organizations and the first part of the alphabetical survey of countries of the world. Part 1 International Organizations - Detailed entries for international organizations variously include contact details, brief history, membership, organization, activities, finance, allied or associated organizations' contact details, and publications. The section on 'Other International Organizations' gives briefer entries which include contact details, objectives and activities, names of chief executives and a list of publications. Part two Countries of the world - individual country entries comprise an introductory survey - which includes e.g. location, climate, history, government, defence, economic affairs, education, public holidays, and weights and measures; a statistical survey of demographic, trade and economic indicators; and a directory section which details the constitution - names and titles of heads of state and ministers, recent election results, names of governors, contact details of political organizations and of diplomats; the judicial system; religion - organizations and contact names; the Press - titles and contact details for e.g. newspapers, periodicals and news agencies, publishers, broadcasting and communications; Finance - detailing e.g. banks, stock exchanges and insurance companies; Trade and Industry - details of government agencies, development, agricultural and utilities organizations; transport - organisations and companies; and tourism.

Part one of this extensive work deals with the theory and history of foreign policy; part two considers the analysis of foreign policy in terms of actors, contexts and goals; while part three contains 9 case studies including the neocons and the invasion of Iraq, the Tiananmen Square massacre, Britain and Iraq, the EU and Russia over energy, and the expansion of the EU.

► Global politics of defence reform/ edited by Thomas Bruneau, Harold Trinkunas

New York : Palgrave Macmillan, 2008 xi, 298 p.

This study consists of two sections: the first looks at global trends particularly the effects of globalization, the spread of democracy, and changing threat perceptions as factors influencing defence reform; part two presents several national case studies including Indonesia, India, Taiwan, and the United States.

► Guide for participants in peace, stability, and relief operations/ edited by Robert M Perito

Washington, DC : US Institute of Peace Press, 2007 340 p.

A guide to the main organizations involved in peace operations: international such as U.N. (including U.N. structures and peace missions), NGOs such as ICG, and the US military. The role of each kind of organisation in peace and disaster relief missions is described, and the introduction provides a number of involvement scenarios. Includes list of additional resources and detailed index.

Arizona : Wheatmark, 2007

147 p.

Collection of short accounts of intelligence incidents most of which took place in the Asia Pacific during or soon after the Second World War. The author is a former editor of the U.S. National Counter Intelligence Corps magazine.

► Just and unjust wars : a moral argument with historical illustrations/ Michael Walzer

4th ed. New York : Basic Books, 2006 xxviii, 361 p.

Contains a new preface by the author (written 2005?) otherwise the text is the same as the first edition of 1977. A particular strength of the book lies in directly linking ethical and moral questions about conflict to specific examples drawn from the entire history of warfare, from the ancient world to My Lai.

Military education : a reference handbook/ Cynthia A Watson

Westport CT: Praeger Security, 2007 xv, 190 p.

Provides a succinct account of the evolution of professional military education in the United States giving overviews of all the military education establishments and their curricula. Almost half of the book is given over to official documents the most substantial being the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Instruction on Officer Professional Military Education Policy, 22 December 2005. Glossary, information sources, index.

► Military transformation and modern warfare : a reference handbook / Elinor Sloan

Westport CT : Praeger Security International, 2008 viii, 183 p.

Study of military transformation that considers different meanings attached to the term, and considers how transformation is being implemented in the USA, China, Russia, NATO, Australia, Britain, Canada, France and Germany. Notes some of the limitations of high-tech militaries, and the need to retain traditional warfighting capabilities while also preparing for more insurgencies and low intensity conflicts.

Muhammad : Islam's first great general/ Richard A Gabriel.

Norman OK: University of Oklahoma Press, 2007

XXXI, 355 p.: maps.

Drawing on a wide range of sources this book considers the prophet Muhammad's military expertise describing battles and other actions in chronological order. In military terms Muhammad's achievements changed Arab warfighting by showing new ways of organising and managing armies, of approaching conflict, and highlighting the need for strategic vision. The book starts with a review of the strategic setting of the period including the Byzantine and Persian empires, then discusses the military tactics, weapons, transport and ethics prevailing in Arab society at the time, before leading in to show how the Prophet revolutionised command and control, strategy, and tactics.

► Newnes mechanical engineer's pocket book / Roger L Timings.

3rd ed. Oxford: Newnes, 2006 xviii, 739 p.: ill.

In this edition the emphasis has changed from manufacturing to design engineering. The book contains a wealth of engineering data in the following main sections: engineering mathematics; engineering statics; engineering dynamics; fastenings; power transmission; engineering materials; dimension tolerances; computer-aided design. The preface explains a typical entry in the British Standards catalogue, and the BS review process. More information about British Standards is in Appendices. Index.

► Sea lanes and pipelines : energy security in Asia/ Bernard D Cole

Westport CT: Praeger, 2008 xiv, 262 p.: maps.

This book is concerned with the military aspects of energy security in maritime Asia and is written from a naval perspective. Asia includes the second and third largest energy consumers as well as many of the largest producers but sources and markets are far apart and the vast majority of oil and gas is transported by sea. First the book considers the processes of energy extraction and the threats to SLOCs (sea lines of communication) including sovereignty disputes, then comments on classical maritime theories and the maritime strategy of various Asian states, then assesses regional naval powers (NB data on Brunei is incorrect); the next chapter covers the role of multilateral organisations and arrangements including the UN, APEC, ASEAN, ARF, CSCAP, and the PSI; the

conclusion addresses possible future naval developments in the light of energy demand.

Provides an overview of terrorism in Southeast Asia with particular attention to Jemaah Islamiyah. Considers events in, and/or U.S. cooperation on counterterrorism initiatives with Indonesia, Thailand, Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore, Australia, and briefly Cambodia and Laos. This is a slightly restructured reprint of Congressional Research Service report RL31672 (updated 16 Feb 2006).

► Terrorism : the new world disorder/ Nicholas Fotion, Boris Kashnikov and Joanne K Lekea

London : Continuum, 2008 xix, 187 p.

Three philosophers consider the ethical and moral aspects of terrorism in two different categories: suicide terrorism, and attacks in which the perpetrators intend to survive. Describes examples of terror attacks during the last century ranging from revolutionary terrorism in Russia, the area bombing of Germany in the Second World War, Chechen terrorism, and the Iraq War of 2003. Considers ethical arguments for and against terrorism and concludes with some brief comments on military and non-military ideas about how to respond to terrorism.

► The black swan : the impact of the highly improbable/ Nassim Nicholas Taleb

Newe York: Random House, 2007 xxviii, 366 p.

Black Swans are events that lie outside normal expectations that have great impact, and despite being entirely unpredictable are subsequently subjected to human efforts to explain them and thus make them predictable. The book is an exploration of the concept of uncertainty and the problems inherent in predicting the future.

► The coming of the Third Reich : a history/ Richard J Evans.

New York: Penguin, 2005

xxxiv, 622 p.

First part of Professor Richard Evans huge three volume history of the rise and fall of the Nazis. This volume considers how political, economic, and military events in the nineteenth century and the early decades of the twentieth enabled Hitler and his Nazis to take over Germany and create the Third Reich.

Fully revised edition that describes the history and development of the European Union then looks at specific aspects including the single market, the single currency, common agriculture policy, social policy, environmental policy, freedom of movement within Europe (Schengen Agreements), EU enlargement, civilian power, security and defence, the EU in world affairs, and the future.

► The First World War : the war to end all wars/ Peter Simkins, Geoffrey Jukes and Michael Hickey

Oxford : Osprey, 2003 352 p. : ill. maps.

Combines several previous publications in a single volume to give a complete account of the war in Europe (Eastern and Western Fronts) and the Mediterranean. Includes a section on the post war effects up to 1923.

► The geography of thought: how Asians and Westerners think differently and why/ Richard E Nisbett

New York: Free Press, 2004

xxiii, 263 p.

There are distinct differences in Western and eastern thought process and perceptions. This book considers why this should be, tracing the development of ideas about cognition over three thousand years of human history. Argues that these differences are deeply rooted but that there are indications of some degree of convergence between the two at the present time.

► The leadership pipeline: how to build the leadership-powered company / Ram Charan, Stephen Drotter, James Noel

San Francisco: Jossey Bass, 2001 xx, 248 p.

Although the subtitle of this book refers specifically to companies the concepts contained in it apply equally well to other forms of organization. The emphasis is on ensuring a flow of candidates for senior positions by identifying a six stage process (described as critical leadership passages) which people go through as their careers progress. One of the underlying principles is the need for a change of perception of what is important to the organisation at different levels of seniority. Based in part on experiences at General Electric and other large corporations in the USA.

► The return of history and the end of dreams/ Robert kagan

New York : Alfred Knopf, 2008 115 p.

Charts the rise and fall of the brief period of euphoria in international relations that followed the end of the Cold War (characterised in Francis Fukuyama's book 'the end of history'), and takes a sober look at the shaping of great power relations in the early years of the 21st century.

► The starfish and the spider: the unstoppable power of leaderless organizations/ ri Brafman and Rod A Beckstrom

New York: Portfolio, 2006

230 p.

Develops the idea that organisations are of two types: either "spiders" hierarchical and rigid with top down management, or "starfish" flat and decentralised with peer-to-peer relationships.

Argues that starfish organisations that lack traditional hierarchies and leadership structures are increasingly important in the modern internet based world. Presents a variety of examples in support of the idea and identifies 10 rules which apply to the new style leaderless organization.

► The Third Reich at war : how the Nazi's led Germany from conquest to disaster/ Richard J Evans

London : Allen Lane, 2008 xvii, 926 p.

Concluding volume of Professor Evans exceptional social history of the rise and fall of the Third Reich. This volume covers the period of the Second World War and in particular the aspects of "conquest, subjugation and genocide". The Nazis were obsessed with racial purity and considerable efforts and resources were used to deal with (i.e. exterminate) millions of Slavs, Jews, gypsies, mentally ill, physically handicapped, homosexuals, Jehovah's Witnesses, and criminals. Meanwhile the German people had been taught to expect the state to provide for all their needs including protection from enemies when, as during the huge bombing raids on German cities, the system failed resentment was often aimed at the Nazis rather than the attacking forces. Nazism thus contained the seeds of its own destruction. The book begins with the invasion of Poland and ends with the total collapse of Germany.

▶ The Third Reich in power/ Richard J Evans

New York; London: Penguin, 2005 xvii, 941 p.

Second volume (of three) of Professor Evans comprehensive and highly readable study of the rise and fall of the Nazis. This volume runs from the Nazis seizure of power in early 1933 to the brink of war in 1939. Evans draws on a vast array of original documents from personal diaries to state papers.

▶ The wisdom of crowds/ James Surowiechi

New York: Doubleday, 2004

xxi, 306 p.

An assessment of the apparently counterintuitive proposition that collective intelligence is more likely to produce right answers than clever or intelligent individuals. The book makes clear that it is not an argument against expertise but that expertise is just one among many factors. Discusses how organizations could benefit from corporate wisdom (though if all organizations applied the concepts then the advantage might prove elusive). This edition includes a new afterword by the author.

► Understanding and managing organizational culture / Orla O'Donnell and Richard Boyle

Dublin, Ireland : Institute of Public Administration, 2008 xiii, 95 p.

This study originating from Ireland considers what is meant by organisational culture in the public sector, why it is important to public service managers, what managers can do to influence culture, and the close relationship between culture and leadership. Looks at international experience in both public and private sectors, and identifies six key issues that must be addressed to create a more developmental and performance oriented culture.
